

Yurts (continued) Three, 24-foot yurts are located in the campground and are equipped with basic furnishings, TV with DVD and VCR, microwave oven, gas grill, electricity, heat, water hook-up, as well as an outdoor picnic table and fire ring.

Two additional yurts, a 12-foot and a 16-foot are at more remote, wilderness locations and have an outhouse and basic furnishings.

DIRECTIONS

To Great Pond from New Hampshire border, take the Maine Turnpike north, (I-95N) to Exit 44 (signs for South Portland/I-295 North.

Continue on I-295 North until it merges with I-95 North.

Continue on I-95 North to Exit 182A which is I-395.

Travel I-395 to exit 6A, Route 1A South.

Turn left on to Route #46.

Turn right on to Route #9 for approximately 14 miles.

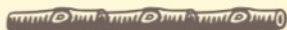
Turn left at the Great Pond Business District sign
(first left after Route 179)

Continue for 1.4 miles

Turn left on to Great Pond Road

Continue seven miles, take slight left on to Dow Pines Road.

Total mileage, approximately 217 miles.

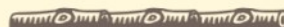


The Great Pond Outdoor Adventure Center is a four season recreational facility, located in Great Pond, Maine.

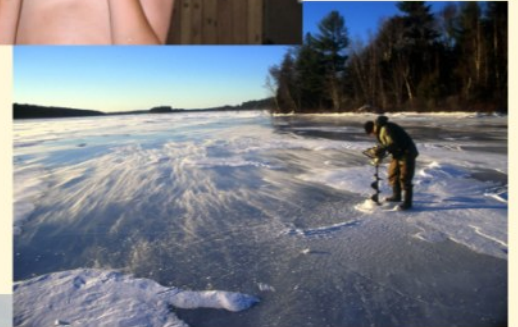
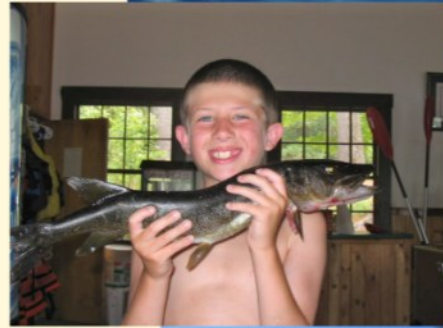
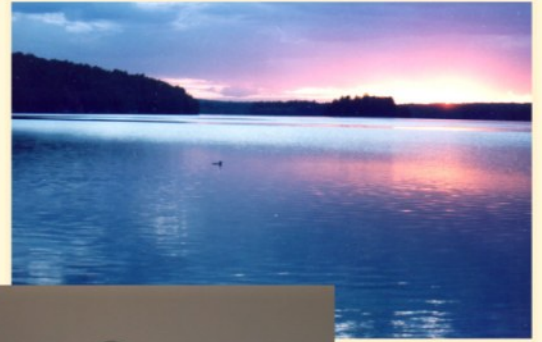

POLICIES & PROCEDURES

Reservations

Authorized patrons may make reservations up to 12 months in advance by calling Great Pond Outdoor Adventure Center at (207) 584-2000. Reservations are based on the daily rate schedule.

Authorized patrons include active duty, retirees, reservist, DoD civilians, 100% disabled vets and National Guard.

Deposits

A 50% deposit (cash, check or credit card) is required to confirm a reservation. Balance is due upon check in at Great Pond Outdoor Adventure Center.

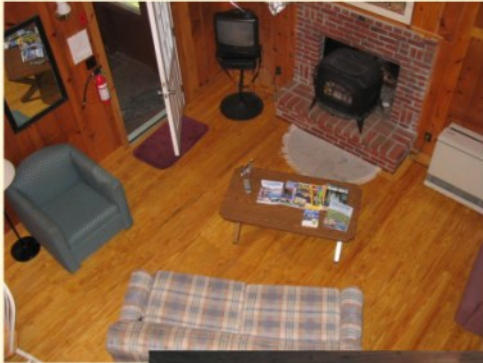
Check In/Check Out

Check in is 2 p.m. Checkout is at 10 a.m. Late check out will be charged an additional days fee after 10 a.m.

Cancellation Policy

No refunds if cancellation is less than 14 days. Full refund of deposit will be given if canceled 14 days or more from check in date.

This pristine site offers many opportunities to explore the Maine woods via canoe or mountain bike. Enjoy fishing, hiking, sailing and swimming without leaving the area or travel south to explore Acadia National Park or visit Canada, 70 miles east on Route 9. Directions are available to local attractions. Great Pond Outdoor Adventure Center includes six rental cabins, the Bigelow Lodge, a recreation hall, 15 campsites and five yurts.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Main Lodge (expected availability, summer 2010)

The Main Lodge sleeps 12 to 14 guests and is fully furnished with two bathrooms, large kitchen with cooking utensils, dishes, linens, towels, three fieldstone fireplaces, glass sunroom, deck and satellite TV. The Lodge can also be used for small receptions, business meetings or recreational functions.

Bigelow Lodge

The lodge sleeps eight to 10 guests. It is fully furnished, with a galley kitchen with dishwasher, cooking utensils, dishes, bathroom with shower, large fieldstone fireplace, lake views with access, canoe and linens.

Five Cabins & Tumbledown

Each cabin sleeps six to eight guests, fully furnished, woodstove, bathroom with shower, TV/VCR/DVD, toaster, coffee maker, microwave, full size refrigerator and electric stove, cooking utensils, dishes, heat, linens, lake views and screened porch.

Tumbledown, one of the original cabins, fully furnished and is equipped with a washer and dryer. Available May through November.

Fifteen RV/Campsites

Each campsite is equipped with electrical and water hook-ups, fire ring and picnic table. Sites are suitable for RV, pop-up or tent camping. Bathhouse with shower and toilet facilities located near sites. There is an on-site waste disposal station located near the campsite area.

Yurts

A Yurt is a unique round structure that combines the qualities of a tent in that they have canvas side walls and the stability of a quasi-cabin in that they have a wood skeleton complete with windows, a door and skylight and they are constructed on a raised wooden deck.
